

Scientific name: Carex specuicola J. T. Howell

(common name) Navajo sedge

Family: Cyperaceae (Sedge family)

Synonyms: None

Global Distribution:

Originally though to be endemic to San Juan County, Utah but also found in Desolation Canyon (primarily Carbon Co. but also Emery Co.); and Coconino County, Arizona

Land Ownership:

Navajo Nation Tribal Lands, NPS - Glen Canyon NRA and Natural Bridges NM, BLM - Price Field Office

Habitat:

San Juan: restricted to sandstone seeps-springs, pockets, or hanging gardens, ranging from almost inaccessible sheer cliff faces to accessible alcoves at 5,700 to 6,000 feet elevation, Desolation Canyon: 4,300 to 4,600 ft elev, (Wasatch Formation), late June - July.

Comments:

Resembles *C. atrata.*. Has been confused in sandstone habitats with *C. rossii* and *C. aurea*. *C. utahensis* also occurs in Desolation Canyon.
