

## DRABA BURKEI

Scientific name: Draba burkei (C. L. Hitchcock) Windham & Beilstein

(common name) Burke's draba

Family: Brassicaceae

(common name) Mustard family

#### **Synonyms:**

D. maguirei C.L. Hitchcock var. burkei C. L. Hitchcock

## **Global Distribution:**

Endemic to the Wellsville Mountains and northern Wasatch Range of northern Utah in Box Elder, Cache, Morgan (barely) and Weber Counties

## Land Ownership:

FS - Wasatch-Cache NF, and private

### Habitat:

Talus slopes and rocky outcrops of quartzite, limestone or calcareous shale, in Douglas-fir, mixed conifer, and maple/oak communities at 5,500 to 9,200 feet elevation, May - July.

### **Comments:**

This species was thought to be closely associated with *D. maguirei*, but is actually closer to *D. globosa*. It differs from the latter in growing at lower elevations (below 9.800 feet), and in having styles at least 1 mm in length, while those of *D. globosa* are less than 1 mm and have a more prominent stigma. Both *D. burkei* and *D. globosa* have unbranched trichomes on leaf margins, while those of *D. maguirei* are branched.
