Endemic to Cedar Valley in Iron County, Utah

Land Ownership:

BLM - Cedar City Field Office, and private

Habitat:

Three-awn, needlegrass, matchweed, and black sagebrush communities at 5,400 to 5,900 feet elevation, May - June.

Comments:

Closely related to *P. pinorum*, but differs in the variable leaves which are toothed to entire, the elongated lower two internodes, the lance-attenuate, clasping cauline leaves, the larger blue flowers (14 - 22 mm long), and the larger anthers (1.6 - 1.8 mm long).
